## **Town of Platteville Monthly Board Meeting Minutes**

## **Town Board Meeting**

The meeting was called to order by Tom Weigel at 6:32 P.M. following the Plan Commission meeting.

Members present: Chad Droessler, Aaron Digman, Tom Weigel, Dave Klar, and Nathan Niehaus.

The clerk verified that the open meeting law was met. Notice was posted in 3 locations and the website. WWW.TOWNOFPLATTEVILLE.COM

The agenda was reviewed. Motion by Digman to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Droessler. Motion carried.

The minutes of the July meeting were reviewed. Motion by Droessler to approve the minutes as presented, seconded by Digman. Motion carried.

Klar presented the treasurer's report. Total account balances as of August 1<sup>st</sup> were \$406,845.18. Motion by Digman to approve the treasurer's report, seconded by Droessler. Motion carried.

The bills for the month were reviewed totaling \$86,616.50. Motion by Droessler to approve the bills as presented, seconded by Digman. Motion carried.

An ordinance permitting a small chicken coop in the Town was discussed. This is being looked at as there are requests from residents so they can have small flocks and current county zoning doesn't allow them. More information will be gathered for the September meeting.

Kurt stated that he has been working on patching, that he has been cutting trees and cleaning up debris from storms, there are some fire numbers being taken down on Fountain Bluff and DreamR Court, and that landowners are responsible for fixing their driveways after storms.

Residents present expressed their concerns about the possible new road project to connect Quarry Road with Walnut Dell. Eric Fatzinger was concerned about tax dollars being spent on the project without resident input, Mark Digman, who is a town resident, was at the July meeting and investigated possible grant opportunities for the Town, however no money has been spent on the project, and no board action has taken place. Weigel stated that he has been approached with concerns with only one access to all the houses being built off Walnut Dell. Some residents expressed concern about more traffic, and that if the county wants a new road that it should be the county or the state paying for it.

The board placed the checks in envelopes for the bills to be paid.

Motion by Droessler to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Digman. Motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 7:29 P.M.
